The first step is applying for admission. At Oklahoma State, we're committed to helping qualified students get admitted to OSU to earn their college degrees.

ADMISSIONS DOCUMENTS REQUIRED:

1. Completed admission/scholarship application and \$40 non-refundable application fee or application fee waiver.
2. Official high school transcript reflecting unweighted GPA and class rank (if available).
3. Official ACT or SAT test score(s).



WAYS TO BE ADMITTED

COMPREHENSIVE REVIEW

At Oklahoma State University, ALL STUDENTS are encouraged to apply because we individually review each application for our holistic and alternative admission programs. We consider many factors, including: high school GPA, ACT or SAT scores, responses to application essays, academic letters of recommendation, leadership experience, community involvement and accomplishments.

ACT and SAT scores are computed without the writing score.

15-Unit Core Curricular Requirements: 4 units of English (Grammar, Composition and Literature); 3 units of Mathematics (Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II and above); 3 units of History and Citizenship Skills (Must include 1 unit of American History and 2 units from the subjects of history, Economics, Geography, Government, Civics and/or Non-Western Culture); 3 units lab science (Biology, Chemistry, Physical Sciences, Physics or any lab science certified by school district) and 2 units of other courses selected from any of the sections above or computer science or foreign language.

Home Study or Unaccredited High Schools: Graduates must satisfy the curricular requirements and have either a 1090 SAT or a 24 ACT score. Grade-point average and class rank are not used to evaluate students who fall under either category.

ASSURED ADMISSION

Students qualify for assured admission if they meet one of the following criteria:

- 3.0 unweighted cumulative GPA or better **AND** top 33.3% rank in high school graduating class, **OR**
- 3.0 GPA or better in 15-unit core **AND** 21 ACT/980 SAT or better, **OR**
- 24 ACT/1090 SAT or better.

COMPETITIVE SCHOLARSHIPS

Students compete for these scholarships based upon information provided in your completed scholarship file. The scholarships below can be combined with other scholarship awards.

PRESIDENT'S DISTINGUISHED SCHOLARSHIP

This four-year award requires a 27 ACT/1210 SAT score, a minimum 3.75 GPA and a strong record of leadership.

AMOUNT: \$2,200 per year

PRESIDENT'S LEADERSHIP COUNCIL (PLC) SCHOLARSHIP

This one-year award is given to a select number of freshmen who excel at academics, leadership and community service. Students also serve on the President's Leadership Council and take a two-semester leadership course.

AMOUNT: \$1,500

ACADEMIC COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS

OSU academic colleges award scholarships to freshmen who excel academically and show potential. Amounts and requirements vary.

Your application for scholarships is not complete until we have these items:

- Online Admission Application
- Official High School Transcript
- Completed Essay Responses
- Leadership Experience (Honors, Employment, Activities, etc.)
- Official ACT/SAT Scores
- \$40 Application Fee or Fee Waiver
