FINANCIAL AID TIMELINE *(FOR FALL-ENTERING STUDENTS)*

- Oct. 1** – Complete the 2018-2019 FAFSA as soon as possible after Oct. 1
- Nov. 1** – Early Opportunity Scholarship Deadline
- Feb. 1** – Priority Scholarship Deadline
- May 1** – Deadline to accept some scholarships and financial aid
- July 1** – Deadline for updated test scores and transcripts for final scholarship consideration

FINANCIAL AID FACTS

FILE YOUR FAFSA

File your 2018-2019 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online as soon as possible after Oct. 1 using OSU's school code, which is 003170. FAFSA information is used to determine eligibility for federal grants, work-study, loans and need-based scholarships. Some aid programs are first-come, first-served and have limited funds available. Ask us for more information or visit fafsa.gov. Remember, you should never pay to complete the FAFSA.

WHAT IS FINANCIAL AID?

Financial aid is any grant, scholarship, loan or federal work-study program that helps a student pay for college.

TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID

FEDERAL FINANCIAL AID

- Grants are awards that do not have to be repaid.
- Loans (available to students and parents) must be repaid.
- Work-study provides job opportunities to students allowing them to earn money to pay educational expenses.

STATE FINANCIAL AID

- Oklahoma provides grants and scholarship programs such as Oklahoma's Promise to state residents that do not have to be repaid.

OSU SCHOLARSHIPS

- OSU offers scholarships based on need and merit. Awards do not have to be repaid.

WHAT DO YOU NEED TO APPLY?

1. Completed admissions/scholarship application admissions.okstate.edu/apply.
2. \$40 nonrefundable application fee (or fee waiver).
3. Official high school transcript reflecting unweighted GPA and class rank (if available).
4. Official ACT or SAT scores.
5. Completed essay responses (students seeking admission by comprehensive review).

▶ COMPLETE YOUR SCHOLARSHIP FILE

Your application for admission is also your application for scholarships, but your file is not complete until we have these items:

- Completed Essay Responses
- Leadership & Involvement Experience *(Honors, Employment, Activities, etc.)*

The Early Opportunity Scholarship Deadline is **Nov. 1**, while all scholarship materials must be submitted by **Feb. 1** to ensure scholarship consideration for fall-entering students. For more information on how to complete your file, visit admissions.okstate.edu/scholarship-file.

WAYS TO GET IN...

COMPREHENSIVE REVIEW

At Oklahoma State University, ALL STUDENTS are encouraged to apply. We individually review each application for our holistic and alternative admission programs. We consider many factors, including high school GPA, ACT or SAT scores, responses to application essays, leadership experience, community involvement and accomplishments.

ASSURED ADMISSION

Students qualify for assured admission if they meet one of the following criteria:

- 3.0 unweighted cumulative GPA or higher **AND** top 33.3% rank in high school graduating class, **OR**
- 3.0 GPA or higher in 15-unit core **AND** 21 ACT/1060 SAT* or higher, **OR**
- 24 ACT/1160 SAT* or higher.

*ACT and SAT scores are computed without the writing score. *SAT scores indicated here represent tests taken on or after the National March 2016 test.*

15-Unit Core Curricular Requirements: 4 units of English (Grammar, Composition and Literature); 3 units of Mathematics (Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II and above); 3 units of History and Citizenship Skills (Must include 1 unit of American History and 2 units from the subjects of history, Economics, Geography, Government, Civics and/or Non-Western Culture); 3 units lab science (Biology, Chemistry, Physical Sciences, Physics or any lab science certified by school district) and 2 units of other courses selected from any of the sections above or Computer Science or Foreign Language.

Home Study or Unaccredited High Schools: Graduates must satisfy the curricular requirements and have either a 1160 SAT or a 24 ACT score for assured admission. Grade-point average and class rank are not used to evaluate students who fall under either category. Students who don't qualify for assured admission will be considered for holistic and alternative admission programs.

COWBOY COVENANT - AN OKLAHOMA'S PROMISE PARTNERSHIP	Oklahoma's Promise is a state scholarship program for registered participants that covers tuition at OSU. Cowboy Covenant is a four-year cash award funded by OSU.	Full tuition (Oklahoma's Promise) AND \$1,000 per year (\$4,000 four-year total)	Available to Oklahoma's Promise recipients who are fully admitted to OSU and demonstrate financial need (as determined by the FAFSA). OKLAHOMA STATE REGENTS' INSTITUTIONAL NOMINEE (OSRHE)	A five-year full tuition waiver and four-year cash award funded by the state. Limited number available.	Up to \$37,200 total	Qualifying criteria set annually by the State Regents in late fall. See okhighered.org/academic-scholars for details.
OKLAHOMA STATE REGENTS' ACADEMIC SCHOLARS (OSRHE)	A five-year full tuition waiver and four-year cash award funded by the state.	Up to \$48,000 total	Based on ACT/SAT scores at or above the 99.5 percentile for OK residents. Additional criteria set annually by the State Regents. See okhighered.org/academic-scholars for details.
NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP	A five-year full tuition waiver and a combination of state, university and National Merit funding. Students may only receive the award with the highest value they are eligible for from the University Assured Scholarship or Partnered Scholarship categories. Exceptions include Oklahoma's Promise and Cowboy Covenant, which can be combined with one award in the University Assured Scholarship or Partnered Scholarship categories. Students must maintain a minimum GPA and number of credit hours per semester to renew assured scholarship opportunities each year. Renewable scholarship qualifications may vary.
